Hello Supervisor Potter and Planner McCue,

I respectfully urge you to reject the proposed Pebble Beach Company golf course project as our Peninsula is laboring under an officially declared water supply Emergency, and because we endure daily gridlock and this project would significantly worsen both situations.

Most importantly the project should be denied because it would permanently destroy huge areas of our vitally needed Monterey pine forest ecosystem and could potentially drive the species to extinction. I have lived in Del Monte Park for the last 30 years and endured the monumental building of the Spanish Bay golf course and the accompanying conveyor belt. I remember a promise by the Pebble Beach Co. to maintain the wetland area north of the Beachcomber Motel, all of which has now filled in with silt. Ducks and geese used to land in the small pond there. It is now completely gone. It taught me to beware of Pebble Beach promises. I also remember jackrabbits in the golf course area, all have disappeared.
