The Planning Commission of the County of Monterey adopts this resolution with reference to the following facts and circumstances:

- A. On July 10, 2002, the Commission adopted Resolution No. 02040 approving a use permit and adopting a mitigated negative declaration for Gerd and Nancy Konieczny's 1,200-square foot agricultural support facility to be used for slaughtering of fallow deer raised on their property and for the processing of deer meat.
- B. Thereafter, on August 12, 2002, Petitioners Elizabeth L. Howard, In Defense of Animals, and the Animal Protection Institute, filed a petition for writ of mandate in Superior Court challenging the Commission's approval of the permit based upon a mitigated negative declaration.
- C. On June 16, 2003, the Superior Court issued a ruling granting Petitioners' request for a writ of mandate. Judgment was entered and a peremptory writ of mandate issued on October 31, 2003 ordering the Commission to "vacate Resolution 02040, including any permits or entitlements, for the project described in that Resolution, and to vacate any environmental clearance granted in connection therewith." The peremptory writ further ordered that the Commission not "take any further action to approve the project without the preparation, circulation and consideration of a legally adequate environmental review document under CEQA with regard to the disease transmission related to deer babesiosis" and "not to take any further action to approve the project without consideration of a solid waste management plan and septic design." The peremptory writ further provided that whether the environmental review be in the form of an Environmental Impact Report ("EIR") or a Mitigated Negative Declaration shall be within the discretion of the Commission.
- D. The peremptory writ required that a return to the writ verifying compliance therewith be filed with the Superior Court within 90 days of the issuance of the writ.
- E. This Commission desires to comply fully and promptly with the Superior Court's peremptory writ of mandate.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

1. Resolution No. 02040, including the approval of any permits or entitlements for the

Koniezcny deer slaughterhouse Project described in that Resolution, and the adoption of a mitigated negative

declaration prepared for said Project, be and is hereby vacated.

2. This Commission will not take any further action to approve the Project without the

preparation, circulation, and consideration of a legally adequate environmental review document under CEQA with regard to the disease transmission related to deer babesiosis and will not take any further action to

approve the Project without consideration of a solid waste management plan and septic design.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be attached to the County of

Monterey's Return to the Peremptory Writ and that such a Return be filed with the Superior Court on or

before January 29, 2004.
