#### BEHAVIORAL HEALTH UNIT SUPERVISOR

## **DEFINITION**

Under direction of a Program Manager, plans, supervises and participates in specific behavioral health service program; supervises staff assigned to the program and does other work as required.

### DISTINGUISHING CHARACTERISTICS

An employee in the class of Behavioral Health Unit Supervisor is responsible for supervising a specific behavioral health service element and the staff assigned to that program. A portion of this individual's time may be with direct clinical work. Work is performed with considerable independence of action; however, guidance, consultation and direction are received from medical and administrative superiors.

This class is distinguished from the next higher class of Program Manager in that the latter is a classification responsible for the administration of multiple program elements, monitors contract providers and is a member of the Division Management Team.

#### **EXAMPLES OF DUTIES**

- 1. Supervises a specific behavioral health program to rehabilitate or maintain mentally and emotionally disturbed individuals; coordinates provision of services with other program elements; participates in developing procedures manuals and instructional material to assist in developing program goals; assists management in evaluating program needs and developing an effective program
- 2. May provide direct clinical work in the treatment of patients within the specific program
- 3. Supervises subordinate professional and paraprofessional personnel in a specific behavioral health program and in recording case history and related records; reviews case records and meets with individual staff members on a regular basis to review assigned cases, progress and problem areas and make recommendations on methods of treatment of patient needs
- 4. Supervises the activities of assigned staff evaluators and confers with staff on a regular basis, recommends disciplinary action
- 5. Plans and conducts unit meetings
- 6. May assist in monitoring patient utilization or level of care with contract providers
- 7. Coordinates the program with related community human services agencies and treatment facilities as assigned; provides consultation services to the community and related agencies as assigned
- 8. Maintains records; prepares reports and correspondence regarding the program
- 9. May meet with community organizations, private individuals, agency administrators and professional staff of mental health facilities to gain cooperation in achieving program goals as assigned.

# **QUALIFICATIONS**

Pursuant to Section 5751 of the Welfare and Institutions Code, possession of any one of the following:

Licensed Clinical Social Worker: to be a graduate of an accredited graduate school of social work and be licensed as a clinical social worker in the state of California.

OR

Licensed Marriage, Family and Child Counselor: to be a graduate of an approved graduate school of marriage, family and child counseling and to be licensed as a marriage, family and child counselor in the state of California.

OR

Clinical Psychologist: to be a graduate from an accredited school of psychology and to be licensed as a clinical psychologist in the state of California.

OR

Psychiatrist: shall have a license as a physician and surgeon in the state of California and show evidence of having completed three years graduate training in psychiatry in a program approved by the American Medical Association or the American Osteopathic Association.

OR

A nurse shall be licensed to practice as a registered nurse by the Board of Nursing Education and Nurse Registration in California and possess a master's degree in psychiatric or public health nursing, and two years of nursing experience in a mental health setting. Additional post baccalaureate nursing experience in a mental health setting may be substituted on a year-for-year basis for the educational requirement.

In addition, any combination of experience, education, and/or training which substantially demonstrates the following knowledge, skills and abilities:

## Knowledge and Skills:

### Thorough knowledge of:

- 1. Methods and techniques of individual, family, group counseling, case management and social rehabilitation
- 2. Community resources available for assistance to individuals suffering form mental and/or emotional problems
- 3. Principles and techniques of diagnosis, treatment and rehabilitation of persons with mental or emotional disorders
- 4. Laws governing behavioral health services in the state of California for a specific treatment service.

### Working knowledge of:

- 1. Cultural habits of ethnic groups
- 2. Community organizations and lines of communication in a specific treatment area
- 3. Principles of training and supervision of subordinate staff

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4. Safety requirements regarding the operation of a specific behavioral health program.

#### Skill and Ability to:

- 1. Effectively counsel patients and conduct individual, family and group therapy or to provide case management or social rehabilitation service
- 2. Supervise and participate in a specialized behavioral health program
- 3. Evaluate effectiveness of program and initiate improvements
- 4. Train, assign and supervise the work of a small staff with varied educational and experience backgrounds
- 5. Speak and write effectively, including preparation of clear and concise records and reports
- 6. Establish effective working relationships with patients, staff, social service agencies, and other contracted in the course of work
- 7. Analyze data and develop conclusions and recommendations regarding a specific program.
